The Teaching Online Certificate program is a structured, flexible program that provides multiple perspectives on best practices in designing, teaching, and engaging learners in an online course. This program allows you to work closely with a mentor to create an individualized learning plan, based on your own unique goals, to help gain valuable insight on a variety of topics from basic course design through techniques to improving your virtual facilitation skills.

This program will use Blackboard to deliver live interactive sessions and the synchronous course components. Faculty can expect to spend about 5-7 hours to complete each week's assignment.

Faculty who may not be interested in attaining the certificate are welcome to tailor the program requirements.
